- (d) Topics like OECD guidelines, GLP, BABE, GMP should be considered to include in the syllabus.

Inclusion of newly incorporated provision adding to functions of NIPER Senate, as under 3.2.2(1)" to nominate two professor the Board of Governors of the Institute".

It is to inform that the NIPER (Amendment) Bill, 2021 ha been passed by the Parliament in December 2021. In this regards, the following two provisions to be incorporated in the statues to the amendment of the act as directed by the Department of Pharmaceuticals, GoI.

a. 2(j) Institute means any of the Institutions mentioned in

- column (3) of the Schedule to National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (Amendment) Act, 2022. (As amended vide section 2(g)of NIPER Amendment Act)
- b. Newly incorporated provision adding to function of NIPER Senate, as 3.2.2(1) "to nominate two professors to the Board of Governors of the Institute"

In order to implementation of the above NIPER Amendments, it is proposed by the institute the below two nominations among Senior Faculty level for Board of Governors.

- (i) Dr. P. Ramalingam, Associate Professor, Department of Pharmaceutical Analysis.
- (ii) Dr. Vipan Kumar Parihar, Associate Professor, Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology.

The Committee may approve the above two nominations and newly incorporated provisions in the NIPER Amendments.
